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

About the project:

ABOUT THE PROJECT:

ERASE THE HATE IS **ERASMUS+ YOUTH EXCHANGE** PROJECT THAT ADDRESSES THE DAMAGES THAT SOCIETIES ARE HAVING BASED ON DISCRIMINATION AND RACISM IN MANY DIFFERENT WAYS. THE MOST ERODING SIDE EFFECT OF DISCRIMINATION IS THAT FOR A LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE LIVING IN EUROPE AND IN THE WORLD THE DISCRIMINATION AFFECTS THEIR HUMAN DIGNITY, THEIR LIFE OPPORTUNITIES, THE PROSPERITY AND WELLBEING, AND IN MANY CASES ALL THESE THINGS LEAD TO HATE SPEECH OR ESCALATE INTO A HATE CRIMES WHICH AFFECTS THE PERSONAL SAFETY OF AN INDIVIDUAL.

02. ABOUT US

Workshop Role play “Act out your stereotypes”

“Act your stereotypes” is a role play game where the national groups act out the most commonly known stereotypes about their country. The goal of this activity is for the participants to get to discuss and see the different stereotypes and prejudices they have about the other countries and how do they have an impact on discrimination against people of a certain nationality.

Workshop “What is discrimination?” (group work) and discussion about the topic

The participants had a chance to discuss how they perceive discrimination and the many aspects of it. The goal of this activity was to see how the participants understand discrimination and what can we do to have an impact in stopping it.

DAY 2 - GET INTO THE TOPIC

Discussion: Danger of a single story



During this activity the participants had the task to listen to the TED talk of a woman by the name of Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie and her story by the name of "Danger of a single story". After listening to a part of a story the national groups had to answer to certain question and discuss the answers with the other groups after the questions were answered.

Photo voice- Photography and Narrative- Writing

The goal of this activity was to see how the participants perceive one image and what the real story behind it is. Each of the participants had chosen a picture with a certain backstory and was asked how do THEY perceive an image. The conclusion of this activity was to not judge something based on the first look because behind every image there is a story. **This activity was led by a young fasilitator from Romania, Octavian, with a help of a reporter from Italy, Alessia.**



ACTIVITIES:

Take a step forward

Take a step forward is a game where the participants are given certain roles which represent specific characters of different social status in one's society. Then the participants are asked to take a step forward if they agree or disagree with a specific question regarding the role. At the end the participants look around to see where the others are standing. The conclusion of this activity was for the participants to see that different groups of people are treated differently based on their social status.

Hate speech and hate crime


This was an activity where the participants had a discussion and learned about hate speech and hate crimes and what separates hate speech and hate crimes from other types of crimes. The participants had a chance to learn different types of crimes and the thin line between what is considered hate crimes and different types of crimes.

Workshop "Media and Discrimination in the Media"

During this workshop the participants who were divided in different groups and were given the task to present what do the terms echo chamber and echo-bubbles mean and what we can do to escape them. This activity is important in fighting hate crimes and hate speech because one of the main tools used for spreading the hate crimes are social media platforms. **The activity was organized by a Greek and Italian fasilitators,** Nef and Alessia.

CASE STUDY (European Court of Human Rights)

In this activity the participants were divided into three separate groups - council, sued, defender, not depend on they're nationalities. The group was given a real court case about an Indian man in the UK, who sued the UK government for human rights violations. The goal of the activity was to see the three perspectives in the case.

Concept of culture was an activity where the participants discussed what culture means to them and how culture can affect our way of thinking.




Cultural crossover

Artivism as a tool for fighting discrimination and hate speech




